



Joint Occupational Health and Safety Committees

Course Overview:

Joint Occupational Health and Safety Committees (JOHSC) examines the roles and responsibilities of the JOHSC as a whole and of JOHSC members, and explains the rules and principles governing committee meetings.

Who Should Take the Course?

This course is appropriate for all members of the workplace that are being asked to participate in their JOHSC including employers, managers, supervisors and workers. **Note: This course has been designed for workplaces that ARE NOT governed by Canada Labour Code legislation.**

Course Objectives:

Ultimately, the goal of this course is to educate participants on the principles of due diligence and the rights of the worker, including the right to refuse work. Also, this course will explain the role of the JOHSC in fulfilling an organization's safety requirements.

This course is presented in 5 modules:

1. OH&S Legislation
2. An Overview
3. Structure
4. Duties, Power and Liability
5. Agenda, Conduct and Minutes

Evaluation Process:

At the end of each module, there is a test. Participants must successfully complete the test before continuing to the next module. Participants that do not achieve 100% can review the module content and try as many times as necessary to advance and complete the course. Test questions are randomly selected from a test bank, making each test unique.

Upon successfully completing all modules, there is a printable certificate for your records.

Course Duration:

This online course is self-paced. Participants may leave the course at anytime and can resume where they left off. The duration will depend on the individual participant and their prior knowledge of the subject matter. On average, the timeline for completion will be 2 - 5 hours.
